ASU encourages all students, faculty and staff to visit the following sites for answers to questions regarding many aspects of student, faculty and staff processes at the university.

- Cheating on an academic evaluation or assignment
- Plagiarizing
- Academic deceit, such as fabricating data or information
- Aiding academic integrity policy violations and inappropriately collaborating
- Falsifying academic records.

This policy was established by the Office of Research Integrity and Assurance to act as a resource for investigators and the university as a whole to achieve and maintain ethical principles and compliance with federal, state, and university regulations governing research.
